- Encourage all internal officers to review their consumption of goods and services in order to reduce usage where possible
- Give preference to products and services that can be manufactured used and disposed of in an environmentally and socially responsible way.
- Ensure that sustainability criteria are included in all pre-qualification questionnaires and tender specifications.
- Consider whole life costs when assessing product suitability.
- Work with suppliers/contractors to reduce environmental and social impacts by joint working.
- Procuring equipment that is energy efficient and taking into account whole life costs. Giving preference to products that carry the Eco-label [www.eco-label.com](http://www.eco-label.com) where ever possible.
- Minimise use of virgin and non-renewable materials.
- Maximise use of post-consumer materials.
- Promote equalities in procurement and acknowledge the value of a diverse and competitive supply market and offer equal opportunities to all members of the business community and ensure that are supplies comply and promote equal opportunities to its employees.
- Encourage the use of the local business community that employs local labour and adhere to the Government's Small Business Friendly Concordat.
