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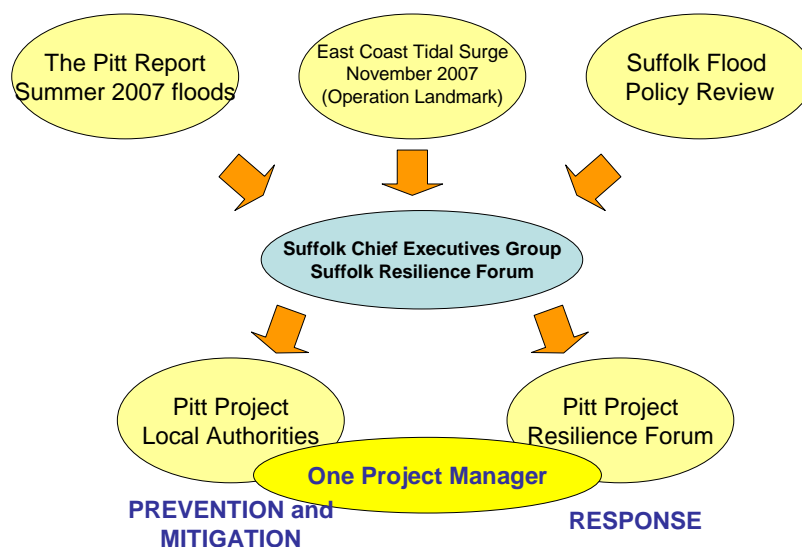

- ### Suffolk Approach
- Close relationship between LA and SRF projects
 - Difficult (non-sensible) to disconnect
 - Local Authorities are key players in SRF and are involved with SRF Pitt activities
 - Not just Joint Emergency Planning Unit

Suffolk Approach - LA

- SCC E&T are leading (Pitt/14)
- Senior Officer lead in each authority and Officer Working Group in each authority
- Suffolk Flood Risk Management Partnership
 - Local Authorities
 - Environment Agency, Anglian Water, Essex & Suffolk Water, Highways Agency, 3 * Internal Drainage Boards and Broads Authority (GO-East)
 - Cross organisational issues & approaches
- Link into SSP Greener County Theme
- Suffolk Joint Scrutiny Panel (Pitt/90)

Suffolk Approach - SRF

- Working through SRF Working Group structure
 - Task/Incident specific WGs e.g. Flood
 - Functional/Cross-Incident WGs e.g. Health, Communications & Humanitarian Assistance
- Working with partner Agencies
 - Building relationships
 - Creating connections
- Review and Update multi-agency plans
- Feed into Training & Exercise planning

Flood & Water Management Bill

- Draft has been out for consultation (July, combined Suffolk LA response)
- Enacts most of the Pitt recommendations that are not covered in other legislation
- PLUS much more
- Parliamentary time? EFRA review?
